GENERAL CONDITIONS

This match is an individual 3x20 Shot Match...60-shot total match. All guidelines for registered matches will be followed. All challenges and protests are resolved on the match premises according to procedures outlined in the NRA Rule Book Section 16.

RULES: NRA Sporter Air Rifle rules shall govern this match.

Individual Match – Open to anyone who meets the eligibility requirements.

Competitor Number Limitations – 64 individuals

Eligibility: Age of Competitors: The age of the competitor shall be determined by the date of the first shot going down range for each tournament. If a competitor has a birthday on July 2, 2024, and they turn 18, they are not eligible to shoot in the DNARM 2024 Match. Photocopies of each competitor's birth certificate must be available on request.

PARENTAL PERMISSION: Each shooter is required to have the following forms completed by a parent: Media Release, Medical Authorization and Liability Release. These forms must be signed by the competitor's parent or guardian and returned with the other registration forms before the competitor is permitted to participate in the Match. **Reminder - all forms must be completed online at www.daisynationals.com.**

NRA MEMBERSHIP NUMBER – NRA membership is not required. If you are a member of NRA, indicate your membership number.

NRA National Record: To set an NRA National Record, you must be a current NRA member, or your club must be a current member.

Registration: Opens May 6th at 10:00 a.m. and closes May 24th at noon (Central Time).

Registration Fee: No registration fee if submitted by the deadline. A late registration fee will be assessed if submitted after noon on May 24th. The fee will be \$50 and will be collected on the day of registration at the match, June 30th.

Firing Starts: First Relay will start at 8:00 a.m. Doors open 30 minutes prior to start time.

SCORING: We use the Orion scoring system for all targets. Targets will be scored, and a shot summary sheet will be posted, at the end of each shooting relay. There will be a 30-minute challenge period to look over your scoring summary sheet and targets. Each team will be given one pass to the target review room. Coaches will be looking for administrative errors where the shot is not a reasonable interpretation of the actual shot. Coaches may be allowed to view that shot in Orion if there is an error. There will be no scoring challenges to targets that have been scored by the Orion System. Once the targets are reviewed, the coach will turn the targets upside down on the table and sign the back of the top target. Targets will not be removed from the scoring room. Any targets missing at the end of the challenge time will be given a zero. Times for the challenge period will be posted when all targets have been scored at the end of each relay. The use of scoring plugs will not be allowed. (Supersedes NRA rule 14.3.1). Changes from the rule book as indicated in the match program have been approved by the National Rifle Association.

SAFETY: Safety is the foremost priority in all shooting sports activities, including this match. Participants and coaches must be aware of and adhere to all safety precautions, including but not limited to:

- A) Carrying and Handling Rifles.
- B) Clear Barrel Indicators are mandatory.
- C) All range commands.
- D) How to clear a loaded rifle when a “STOP FIRE” or emergency occurs.

CHALLENGE PERIOD: Targets will be scored, and a shot summary sheet will be posted at the end of each Relay. There will be a 30-minute challenge period to look over your scoring summary sheet and targets will be at the end of your relay each day. The start and ending challenge time will be posted on the statistical room door by the statistical office staff. Competitors or Coaches will not be able to challenge a match after the challenge time for that match has ended (Rule 16.1(a) and 18.11).

SQUADDING & SHOOTING SCHEDULE: Will be assigned by Daisy.

COURSE OF FIRE: The course of fire will be a 3X20.

Preparation & PRONE unlimited sighting shots	8 minutes
PRONE, 20 record shots	20 minutes
Change-over period prone to standing	5 minutes
Standing unlimited sighting shots	5 minutes
STANDING, 20 record shots	25 minutes
Change-over period standing to kneeling.	5 minutes
Kneeling unlimited sighting shots	5 minutes
KNEELING, 20 record shots	20 minutes

DISTANCE FIRED: 10 meters.

RIFLE: DAISY / AVANTI AIR RIFLE ONLY – 599, 753, 853, 887, 888, 953 and Valiant

TARGETS: Orion Air Rifle Targets

TIME LIMITS: NRA Rule 8.2
