GENERAL CONDITIONS

This match is for 4-manTeam/Individuals 3x20 Shot Match...60-shot total match. All guidelines for registered matches will be followed. All challenges and protests are resolved on the match premises according to procedures outlined in the NRA Rule Book Section 16.

RULES: NRA Sporter Air Rifle rules shall govern this match.

Individual Match – Open to anyone who meets the eligibility requirements.

Competitor Number Limitations – 40 Teams and/or 160 competitors

Eligibility: Age of Competitors: The age of the competitor shall be determined by the date of the first shot going down range for each tournament. If a competitor has a birthday on July 12, 2026, and they turn 20, they are not eligible to shoot in the DNARM 2026 Match. Photocopies of each competitor's birth certificate must be available on request.

PARENTAL PERMISSION: Each shooter is required to have the following forms completed by a parent: Media Release, Medical Authorization and Liability Release. These forms must be signed by the competitor's parent or guardian and returned with the other registration forms before the competitor is permitted to participate in the Match. **Reminder - all forms must be completed online at daisynationals.com**

NRA MEMBERSHIP NUMBER – NRA membership is not required. If you are a member of NRA, indicate your membership number.

NRA National Record: To set an NRA National Record, you must be a current NRA member, or your club must be a current member.

Registration: Opens May 4 at 10:00 a.m. and closes May 22 at noon (Central Time).

Registration Fee: No registration fee if submitted by the deadline. A late registration fee will be assessed if submitted after noon on May 22. The fee will be \$100 and will be collected on the day of registration at the match, July 10.

Firing Starts: First Relay will start at 7:30 a.m. Doors open 30 minutes prior to start time.

SCORING: We use the Scopes/Orion scoring system for all targets. Scores will be available online for review as the targets are scored. There will be a 30-minute challenge period to look over your scoring summary sheet and targets. Each team will be given one pass to the target review room. Coaches will be looking for administrative errors where the shot is not a reasonable interpretation of the actual shot. There will be no scoring challenges to targets that have been scored by the Scopes/Orion System. Once the targets are reviewed, the coach will turn the targets upside down on the table and sign the back of the top target. Targets will not be removed from the scoring room. Any targets missing at the end of the challenge period will be given a zero. Times for the challenge period will be posted when all targets have been scored at the end of each relay. The use of scoring plugs will not be allowed. (Supersedes NRA rule 14.3.1). Changes from the rule book as indicated in the match program have been approved by the National Rifle Association.

SAFETY: Safety is the foremost priority in all shooting sports activities, including this match. Participants and coaches must be aware of and adhere to all safety precautions, including but not limited to:

- A) Carrying and Handling Rifles.
- B) Clear Barrel Indicators are mandatory.
- C) All range commands.
- D) How to clear a loaded rifle when a "STOP FIRE" or emergency occurs.

<u>3.19 Eye Protection</u>: All competitors and coaches are required to wear eye protection on the firing line. No ear buds or headphones connected to devices will be allowed on the ready or firing line.

CHALLENGE PERIOD: There will be a 30-minute challenge period to look over your scoring summary sheet and targets at the end of your relay each day. The start and end challenge time will be posted on the statistical room door by the statistical office staff. Competitors or Coaches will not be able to challenge a match after the challenge time for that match has ended (Rule 16.1(a) and 18.11).

SQUADDING & SHOOTING SCHEDULE: Will be assigned by Daisy.

COURSE OF FIRE: The course of fire will be a 3X20.

Top 10 Shoot Off: The top 10 aggregate scores will have the opportunity to compete in our shoot off to be held after the regular match. Qualified shooters will shoot 10 shots in the standing position in the opening ceremony room. Everyone is welcome to attend.

• Scoring Targets for the Top 10 shoot off - target will be scored using the same rules governing the Air Rifle match - one shot per bull, excessive hits on a single bull not penalized for first 2 occurrences, etc. etc.

Continuing Education Funding

Will be issued for competitors in the Top 10 Shootout and the Top 3 aggregate shooters from the match. Your competitor must have a 529 Savings Plan established.

The 529 Savings Plan is a tax-advantaged account that allows the beneficiary to use the funds for all educational expenses, from trade school costs to colleges, and even school expenses in grades K-12. Each 529 plan varies from state-to-state, so *you will be responsible for investigating and establishing your plan in your state*. There is no age limit, so if the beneficiary decides to first go into the military or even take years off from further education, the money will still be there and available for use. The deadline for you to submit your above information to Daisy Outdoor Products to receive the funding is September 15, 2026.
